## Below are a few examples of what not to do with the Badger Challenge logo. While it may be tempting to alter the logo, please don't deviate from the acceptable logo usage.

| DO NOT rotate the elements | CHALLENGE <br> DO NOT invert the colors of the logo |
| :---: | :---: |
| BADGER <br> CHALLENGE <br> DO NOT move the elements of the horizontal logo | DO NOT alter the proportions of the individual elements on the stacked version |
| BADGER <br> CHALLENGE <br> DO NOT alter the logo colors | DO NOT add a drop shadow to the logo |
